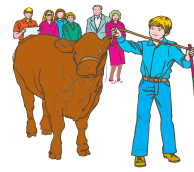

RULES

1. Exhibitors of Dairy animals must have ownership by April 1, 2009, with the exception of Class 1 entries - June 1, 2009.
2. Animals of Ayrshire, Holstein, Jersey, Brown Swiss, and Milking Shorthorn breeds are eligible to compete in the following classes of the Junior Dairy Show. No animals can be shown in more than one Division.
3. Limit 2 entries per class.
4. All animals entered in the Dairy Classes must be registered in the recognized American herd books of their respective breeds.

Classification:

1. Spring Heifer Calves - born March 1 through April 30, 2009.
2. Winter Heifer Calves - born December 1, 2008, through February 28, 2009.
3. Fall Heifer Calves - born September 1, 2008, through November 30, 2008.
4. Summer Heifer Calves - born June 1, 2008, through August 31, 2008.
5. Spring Yearling - born March 1, 2008, through May 31, 2008.
6. Winter Yearling - born December 1, 2007, through February 29, 2008.
7. Fall Yearling (not in milk) - born September 1, 2007 to November 30, 2007.
8. JUNIOR CHAMPION - winners of classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7.
9. RESERVE CHAMPION - except Junior Champion; winners of classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 & second place winner from the Junior Champion class (class #8).
10. Junior Best Three Females. This group to consist of three (3) females from heifer classes (shown in classes 1 - 7), none of which have freshened, all bred by and at least one owned by exhibitor.
11. Junior two-year-old cow born March 1 through August 31, 2007, never freshened.
12. Senior two-year-old cow born September 1, 2006, through February 28, 2007, never freshened.
13. Junior two-year-old cow born March 1 through August 31, 2007, freshened.
14. Senior two-year-old cow born September 1, 2006, through February 28, 2007, freshened.
15. Three-year-old cow born September 1, 2005, through August 31, 2006.
16. Four-year-old cow born September 1, 2004, through August 31, 2005.
17. Aged cow born before September 1, 2004.
18. Dry Cow - Must have freshened at least once.
19. SENIOR CHAMPION - winners of classes 11-18.
20. RESERVE CHAMPION - except Senior Champion; winners of classes 11-18 and second place winner from the Senior Champion class (class #19).
21. GRAND CHAMPION - Winners of classes 8 and 19.
22. RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION - except Grand Champion; winner of classes 8, 19, and 20.

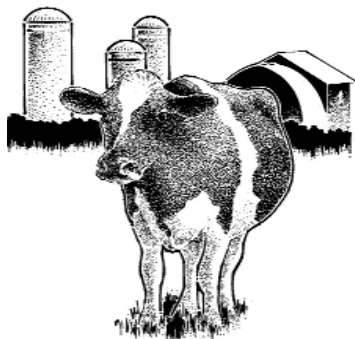

STATE FAIR OF WEST VIRGINIA DAIRY SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

One, \$1,000.00 scholarship is open to a qualified participant from a previous State Fair Junior Dairy Show who is attending college or who is planning to enroll in college this fall. This scholarship will be renewable for up to four (4) years, depending on the current status of the applicant. Rising freshman will receive the scholarship for four (4) years, rising sophomores for three (3) years, etc. Students must maintain full-time status and passing grades for the life of the scholarship.

This award is presented annually and is derived from funds accumulated from the State Fair Endowment program and also the sale of milk donations by dairy exhibitors at the State Fair.
