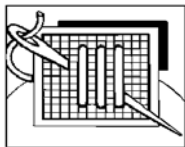

NEW! New classes have been added for 2009 and can be recognized by the identification **NEW!** before the class name and/or description.

Please pay attention to the sections designated amateur and professional. **"Amateur"** is defined as a recreational hobby, not for livelihood or occupational therapy. **"Professional"** is defined as involvement in a hobby that results in financial gain for the participant and the participant deems part of their livelihood or occupational therapy.

RULES:

1. All articles must be the handiwork of the exhibitor and must be clean. Articles must have been made within the last two (2) years (unless otherwise stated) and be in good condition. Articles which have been previously exhibited in this department are not eligible for competition, except where noted.
2. Articles improperly classified or do not conform to rules will not be judged.
3. When there is no competition a ribbon may be given (if worthy) with corresponding money paid. If in a class no exhibits are worthy, neither ribbons nor prize money will be awarded. The decision of the judges is final.
4. Fair officials will take every precaution for the safekeeping of exhibits after their arrival and arrangement in the building, but will not be responsible for any damage or loss that may occur.
5. Entry tags must be attached to exhibit prior to arriving on grounds for delivery. Tags will be mailed when entry form is received.
6. **Each exhibitor is limited to ONE entry per class.**
7. Age of contestant on July 18, 2009, determines the category for competition.
8. Small articles, doilies, place mats, etc., must be mounted on cardboard; dresses, suits, blouses, etc., must be on coat hangers.

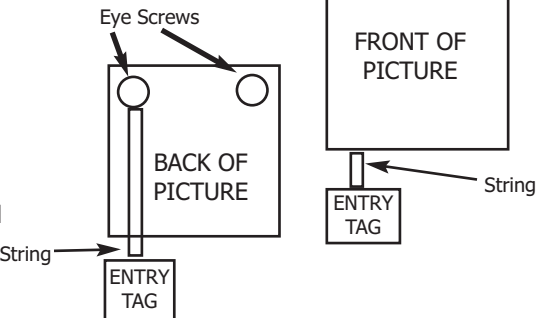

COUNTED CROSS STITCH JUDGING SPECIFICATIONS

1. Cleanliness of work (no hoop marks, stains, etc.).
2. Evenness of stitching.
3. All top stitches should be crossed in same direction
4. No knots in floss on back of fabric.
5. Floss should not be carried across unworked areas on back of design so that thread shows through to front of fabric when design is complete.
6. No floss tails should show through to front of fabric.
7. Overall harmony of floss color and fabric choice.
8. Overall harmony of design with method of finishing (mat, frame, fabric, etc.).
9. Difficulty of work (high fabric choice, use of metallic floss, etc.).

RULES:

1. All quilts and **wall hangings** will be displayed fully opened and suspended from cables across the ceiling of the exhibit hall. Therefore, each quilt and **wall hanging** must have six (6) equally spaced hanging loops sewn across one end. These loops should be approximately 1 1/2" to 2" long, not more than 1/2" wide, and be capable of supporting the quilt's or wall hanging's weight. A 1/2" rod should fit through the loop opening.

QUILTS AND WALL HANGINGS NOT HAVING HANGING LOOPS WILL NOT BE JUDGED IN COMPETITION.

2. **FOR CLASSES 132-156, and 158-159: WRITE THE NAME OF YOUR QUILT OR WALL HANGING ON THE ENTRY FORM.**

3. Quilts entered in all classes except 151 should not be more than three (3) years old.

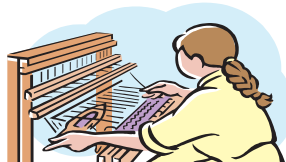

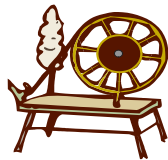

DEPARTMENT E - Section 8 A & B – WOOL

Purpose: The objectives of this exhibit are to encourage the production of high quality wool, to stimulate interest in the proper preparation of wool for market (both commercially and to handspinners), and to reward exhibitors for high quality fleeces.

Judging Saturday, August 15, 8:00 a.m.

1. All wool exhibits must be in place in the Small Stock Arena by 6:00 p.m., Friday, August 14.
2. No entry fees will be charged on fleeces entered for competition.
3. Fleeces must be entered in the name of the grower.
4. Exhibitors are limited to two (2) entries in any class, however, no fleece can compete in more than one class.
5. Each fleece must have been shorn in 2009 and represent no more than 12 months growth, except yearling fleeces, which 16 months growth will be allowed.
6. Any fleece entered in competition should be clean, free of vegetable contamination, dung locks or tags, and show no evidence of moths. It should be properly skirted and tied with paper twine, flesh side out, in a manner to allow it to be handled without falling apart.
7. In case of controversy relative to classification of a fleece, affidavits from the exhibitor may be required. However, in all such controversies and in any interpretation of these rules and regulations, the decision of a committee, to consist of the wool show superintendent and a board of director of the SFWV, shall be final.
8. Fleeces may not be removed from the show arena until 4:00 p.m., Saturday, August 22.
9. Exhibitors must enter fleece competition on the official entry form by the official entry deadline.
